<p><i>There is currently no capability to care for emergency patients that fall within the below categories.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Behavioral Health Services<sup>2</sup></b></li> <li>• <b>Multi-System Trauma</b> (including all burns)</li> <li>• <b>Pediatrics (0-15 years)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Trauma and Medical Conditions</li> <li>◦ Psychiatric Emergencies (0-18years)</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Oncology</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Induction Chemotherapy (Leukemia)</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Hematology</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Exchange Transfusions (Sickle Cell Acute Chest)</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Ophthalmology</b></li> <li>• <b>Pulmonary</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Pulmonary stents or debulking procedures</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Orthopedics</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Acetabular Fractures</li> <li>◦ Musculoskeletal oncology</li> <li>◦ Tibial Plateau Fractures</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Transplant Medicine</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Includes solid organ, cornea, bone marrow and fecal transplants</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Oral and maxillofacial surgery</b></li> <li>• <b>Transfers for forensic evaluation only (Sexual assault, foreign body retrieval)</b></li> <li>• <b>Esophageal Injuries</b></li> <li>• <b>Emergent Aortic Arch/Valvular Cases</b></li> <li>• <b>Gastrointestinal/Interventional Radiology</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Transjugular Intrahepatic Portosystemic Shunt (TIPS) procedure, revision of or complications related to this procedure.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<p><i>Patients that present with these conditions will need some additional medical information to ensure that clinical capability is available.</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Plastics and Hand Surgery</b> (non-reimplantation)           <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Limited on-call coverage depending on surgeon on call, please call PACE to identify capability and specifics</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Dermatology</b> (no inpatient services)           <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Unless systemic disease can accept and have OP follow up (Hospitalist to determine)</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Hemodialysis- Vascular Access Complications</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Currently, no capacity to revise HD shunts but can manage and stop hemorrhage and replace with temporary HD catheter.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Adolescent Patients (16-18)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Limited specialist coverage of operative and ICU care.</li> <li>◦ Patients will be accepted based the admitting specialist who must have agreement from all reasonably needed services prior to acceptance</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Lateral Transfer(s)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Transfers request from hospitals with published same service capabilities shall be reviewed by transfer center medical director or designee.</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Otolaryngology (ENT) Emergencies</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ No traumatic injuries</li> <li>◦ Limited on-call coverage, please call PACE for currentcall coverage</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<p><i>If there is capacity, Patient Care Access clinical providers can accept these patients to the Emergency Department. See note about behavioral health below.<sup>2</sup></i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>General Medicine and Intensive Care</b></li> <li>• <b>General Orthopedic Emergencies</b></li> <li>• <b>Emergency Medicine</b> (Seen in ED and likely discharged after procedure or consult)</li> <li>• <b>Endocrine emergencies</b></li> <li>• <b>Gastrointestinal Emergencies</b> (including ERCP)</li> <li>• <b>Neurology</b> (Stroke and Non-Stroke)</li> <li>• <b>Neurosurgery</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Includes isolated traumatic SDH</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Obstetrics and gynecology</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Includes precipitous deliveries and newborn medicine</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Oncology and Hematological Emergencies</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Includes plasmapheresis</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Surgical Emergencies</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◦ Includes thoracic, vascular, cardiovascular</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
